THE FIRST BATTERED MOTHERS CUSTODY CONFERENCE (BMCC), held in Jan. 2004, brought together experts from across the nation to discuss the serious injustices faced by battered women who seek protection for themselves and their children in the family court/divorce court system. **BMCC II**, held in Jan. 2005, provided a powerful networking opportunity for professionals, domestic violence advocates, organizations, and advocacy groups who are working to expose these problems and develop solutions. **BMCC III**, held in Jan. 2006, provided a venue for the development of unity among all of those affected by these problems and the sharing of action steps that have been proven effective. **The Fourth Conference** conducted a Truth Commission to hear and document the serious injustices suffered by protective mothers within the divorce court system. **Now, the Fifth Battered Mothers Custody Conference** will emphasize providing skills, insights, and strategies to contribute to the self-determination and empowerment of mothers and to the expansion of critical and growing protective mothers' movement. **Registration fee waivers** are available to those involved in child custody litigation, domestic violence advocates, and others who cannot afford to pay the registration fee.
